


# Shared Priority Waters Process in PA





## 25% Public Lands







#### Allegheny:


- Funding support from the USFS with TU is being used to support staff to plan and conduct road-stream crossing surveys
- Recently awarded NFWF grant to develop a 10-yr Conservation Plan focused on the Clarion and Tionesta Watersheds
- Recent projects in Irwin Run





#### Laurel Highlands:

Recently awarded a grant from NFWF to support data collection, compilation
of existing restoration plans, and feasibility to develop a 10-yr conservation
plan for the Kiskiminetas and Conemaugh watersheds.





#### Delaware:


 With funding support from the PA Fish and Boat Commission we are planning to continue conducting Unassessed Stream Initiative surveys and road-stream crossing surveys.





## West Branch Susquehanna:

- 10-yr conservation plan for Pine and Kettle Creek Watersheds
